

Why a "**Ruggedbilt Trailer**"?

First, let's examine the word **rugged** and the word **built**. "Webster's", offers the following:

- **rug-ged**, an adjective meaning tough, strong, robust, vigorous, muscular, sturdy, husky, brawny, uncompromised, firm, unyielding, demanding and capable of enduring hardship and wear and tear (there are more definitions but we think you understand what "Webster" really thinks of the word "Rugged")
- **built** (*bil't*), an adjective meaning of sound and/or sturdy construction

When you combine these two words it's a natural that they spell ruggedbuilt as in "**Ruggedbilt Trailers**". If you would please take a moment to inspect one of our products, trailers, BBQ smoker/grills, or bumpers; you will notice numerous other distinctive standard features that most competitors do not offer or it's a very expensive add-on option. For example, on our deckovers we use a 19lb. steel I-Beam when the majority of our competitors only use 14lb. or maybe 16lb. steel. We reinforce the area over the tires with steel plates; we surround the "Bulldog Dual Jacks" with a steel arm protector so that when you are backing-up to connect, there is less chance that you will damage the jacks. We use "Dexter" axles, considered by most experts to be the absolute best when it comes to small to medium trailers, you will notice "Bulldog" parts and components on most of our products and you will notice "heat shrunk" wiring on all of our products that require electrical services (brakes, lights, etc). Most of our competitors claim that we overbuild our products, we couldn't agree more!!!
